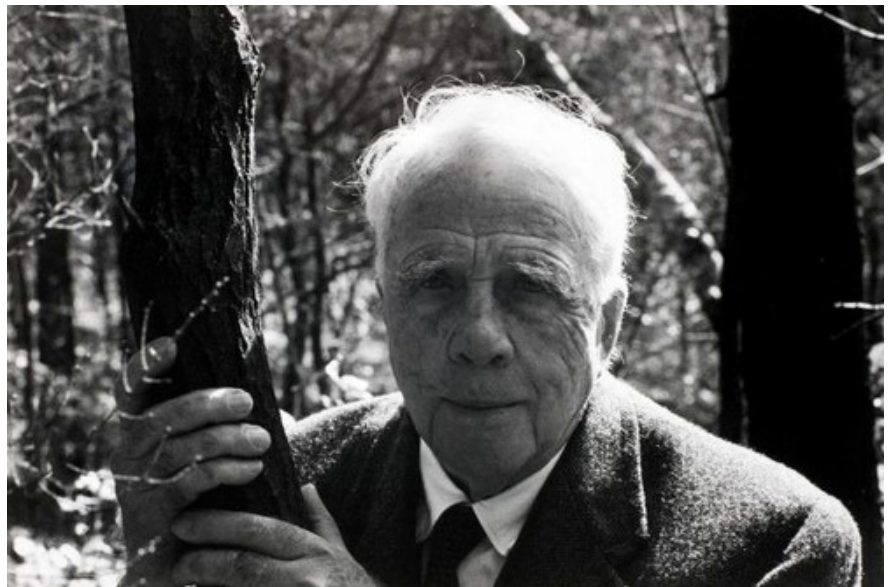

BROOKLINE, NH PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES GRANT TO ATTEND LITERACY PROGRAM AT FAMILY PLACE TRAINING INSTITUTE IN CENTEREACH, NY.

BROOKLINE, NH, FEBRUARY 12, 2025 – THE BROOKLINE, NH PUBLIC LIBRARY IS PROUD TO ANNOUNCE IT HAS BEEN SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE FAMILY PLACE TRAINING INSTITUTE LITERACY PROGRAM ALONG WITH RECEIVING A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,500 TO ENHANCE ITS LITERACY RESOURCES. THIS INVALUABLE TRAINING WILL EMPOWER LIBRARY STAFF TO BETTER SERVE LOCAL FAMILIES WITH YOUNG CHILDREN BY FOCUSING ON TOPICS SUCH AS INFANT BRAIN DEVELOPMENT, EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT, EARLY LITERACY, PARENT EDUCATION, FAMILY ENGAGEMENT, AND MUCH MORE.

THE FAMILY PLACE TRAINING INSTITUTE COVERS A WIDE ARRAY OF ESSENTIAL COMMUNITY BUILDING TOPICS, INCLUDING COMMUNITY OUTREACH, COALITION BUILDING, SPACE DESIGN, COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT, AND THE PLANNING AND OFFERING OF PARENT/CHILD WORKSHOPS. PARTICIPATING LIBRARIES ALSO GAIN INSIGHT INTO CONDUCTING TAILORED ASSETS AND NEEDS ASSESSMENTS TO ENSURE THEIR PROGRAMS MEET THE NEEDS OF THEIR COMMUNITIES.

AS PART OF THE GRANT, THE BROOKLINE PUBLIC LIBRARY WILL RECEIVE \$3,500 TO PURCHASE MATERIALS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE FAMILY PLACE INITIATIVE. IN ADDITION, THE LIBRARY WILL BENEFIT FROM PERSONALIZED TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, INCLUDING AN ON-SITE VISIT FROM FAMILY PLACE NATIONAL STAFF TAILORED TO THE SPECIFIC NEEDS OF THE LIBRARY. ONLINE ACCESS TO ADDITIONAL PRESENTATIONS, WEBINARS, AND UPDATED RESOURCES WILL ALSO BE AVAILABLE TO ENSURE ONGOING SUPPORT AND GROWTH.

THE BROOKLINE PUBLIC LIBRARY WILL JOIN A NATIONWIDE NETWORK OF FAMILY PLACE LIBRARIANS THROUGH THE NATIONAL FAMILY PLACE LISTSERV, WHERE LIBRARY STAFF CAN EXCHANGE IDEAS, RESOURCES, AND SUCCESS STORIES. LIBRARIES INVOLVED IN THE PROGRAM ALSO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND FAMILY PLACE-SPONSORED MEETINGS AND ADVANCED TRAININGS AT REDUCED OR NO COST.

“WE ARE EXCITED TO BE A PART OF THIS TRANSFORMATIVE PROGRAM AND ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO UTILIZING THE RESOURCES AND TRAINING TO BETTER SERVE OUR COMMUNITY.” SAID DIANE LYNCH, DIRECTOR OF THE BROOKLINE PUBLIC LIBRARY. “THIS GRANT WILL ALLOW US TRANSFORM OUR YOUTH SERVICES SPACE, ENHANCE YOUTH SERVICES OFFERINGS, PROMOTE FAMILY ENGAGEMENT, AND STRENGTHEN OUR ROLE AS A RESOURCE FOR LOCAL FAMILIES.”

EDUCATE STATION OFFERS HIGH-QUALITY EDUCATIONAL CONTENT FOR HOMESCHOOLING FAMILIES AND TEACHERS, WITH A FULL CURRICULUM FOR PRE-K TO FIFTH GRADE IN SUBJECTS LIKE ENGLISH, MATH, SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES, AND SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING.

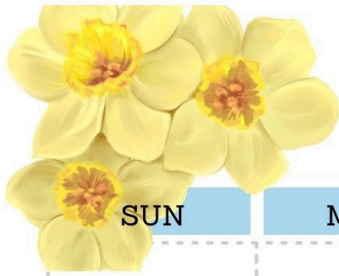
